A small Israeli biotechnology company could help dramatically reduce battlefield casualties in war with a technology it is pioneering to freeze-dry blood. The technology, (6) ----- is being developed by the Israel-based company Core Dynamics, would allow soldiers to carry a unit of their own dried blood as part of their personal equipment. (7) ----- injuries, the freeze-dried blood crystals could be mixed with purified water and transfused into soldiers (8) ----- medics in the field. Since the meanings of the word "Romantic" and the definition of the period "Romanticism" both vary **(11)** ----- discipline, Beethoven's inclusion as a member of that movement or period **(12)** ----- at in context. If we consider the Romantic movement as an aesthetic epoch in literature and the arts generally, Beethoven sits squarely in the first half along with literary Romantics such as the German poets Goethe and Schiller. If, on the other hand, we consider the context of musicology, **(13)** ----- Romantic music is dated later; the matter is one of **(14)** ----- greater debate.
